# PAWS Certification Master's Level

PAWS Master's Certification is a three-part Certificate Program testing the therapy team's visiting skills, demeanor in public, and knowledge and service in representing PAWS for People.

### Our expectations of a PAWS Master's Level Therapy Team

- o superior level of performance and precision
- o well-informed (about PAWS), interested, engaging handler
- o friendly, people-focused pet
- o demonstrate experience with visiting in partner sites as well as in community situations

#### **PREREQUISITES**

- o must be an active member of PAWS for at least 12 months
- o must have completed PAWS' Basic and Advanced Training
- o must have achieved Advanced Level of our Standards of Excellence Testing

## A. PERFORMANCE AND DEMEANOR

1.	PERSONALITY TRAITS
	Human - Confidence in self and pet
	Patient and compassionate with other people and with pet
	Knowledgeable about PAWS and able to convey what PAWS is and does
	Pet - Responsive to handler
	Reliable and consistent in performing behaviors in public
	Comfortable and friendly in all situations
2.	STEX TEST – Master's Level
	Test conducted in a facility or other public place
	BEHAVIOR/DEMEANOR/APPEARANCE
	Pet – continually/reliably calm and well behaved through all 4 sections of certification
	Human - confident of pet's behavior, in control at all times, attentive to pet
	Both – friendly and interested but not intrusive
	FOOD
	Leave it - person drops food in front or to the side of dog, dog obeys "leave it" command
	if pet licks shoe, floor, whatever - stops on command
	Acceptance of treats - gentle with closed fingered delivery

PET ASSESSIMENT
Accepting a friendly stranger - calm and holding still on handler's command
Hhard stare - longer than 3 seconds, does not have to hold eye contact
Sitting politely for petting - calm, interested but not overly excited
Appearance and grooming - fresh, clean, and well-groomed - both human and pet
Loose leash walking - almost a heel but need not be as rigid
Sit on first command and remain seated for 1 minute, with distractions
Down on first command and remain down for 1 minute, with distractions
Staying in place - stay as handler moves to side and talks with someone for 30 second
Staying in place—stay as handler moves to side and talks with someone for 50 second Coming when called - from across the room
Comfortable in all of the following visiting scenarios:
Person in wheelchair Person using walker or cane
Person in bed Person with respirator/"noisy" equipmen
reaction to another dog/animals – calm acceptance of another creature
CROWD - could be several things going on at once
Jerky movements - staggering, hands raised
Loud/angry noises - very loud, very angry and then a petting immediately after
Accepting approach/touch from behind - surprise underbutt grab from behind
Reaction to several distractions - metal tray, fire bell, lots of commotion or crowd
Crowding - several people crowd the dog, like kids would crowd a pet
Distractions - someone carrying something unusual approaches
Reaction to child petting it
Person - comfortable and confident, aware of pet's reactions, reassuring
Pet - quick recovery if startled or wary
VICIT at least a 2 valuate vist
VISIT – at least a 3 minute visit
Use of "tricks of the trade" - head on lap, lean, sitting close to visitee, eye contact
showing real attentiveness in a doggie/pet kind of way
Person: express interest in visitee, not discuss only pet
Able to talk about PAWS comfortably, knowledgeably
Mentions PAWS by name and offers info about who we are and what we do
Approach with smile, strong voice, intro to person, therapy pet, PAWS for People
Interested in person, stays close, sits or stands quietly for petting
SOLUTIONS TO DIFFICULT SITUATIONS
Looking for appropriate use of solutions - naturally by pet or on command
"Watch me" Lean

Directed eye contact Head in lap
Sit, down, stay, settle Paw gently on knee/on side of bed
Use of treat to lure pet or form bond with person
